Call to Confession

Exodus 20:17; 1 Timothy 6:6-9

You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's.

But godliness with contentment is great gain, for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction.

Prayer of Confession

(from Streams of Mercy)

Generous Father,

Every good thing comes from you. You bless us each day with gifts we have not earned—such as life and breath; senses with which to enjoy this world you made for us; bodies that feel, see, smell, and touch. We have not earned these good things. In fact, we were born as rebels against you, and we use the bodies, minds, and senses you have made to sin against you daily by craving what we do not have. With our eyes, we look at others and covet what you have given to them. With our hearts, we grumble and fantasize about how to get them.

We covet the honor, power, wealth, beauty, and success we don't have, and we shake our tiny fists in your face when you withhold what we want so badly. We want better grades, more money, greater health, success at all we do. . . . The list is nearly endless, and we devote a great deal of emotional energy to yearning for what we want while despising what we do have. How easily our desires lead to fights and conflicts among us! We live in a world that is wholly governed by your perfect and sovereign will, yet we quickly grumble against you and despise others. We are weak and full of selfishness, Father—forgive us.

Holy Spirit, let us see that our sin of coveting what our neighbors have is actually a rebellion against you and a rejection of your loving provision for us. Open our eyes to the emotions and beliefs that deceive us and make us miserable with ourselves and others. Help us to see the ugly thoughts and words that flow from our jealousy, and help us to confess this sin, to repent, and to ask for forgiveness. When we see our sin and our guilt overwhelms us, lift our eyes upward from this world and show us afresh the goodness of Christ in our place: his patience and contentment with his low position and difficult calling. He never grumbled about what he didn't have or lusted after the wealth and position of others. He didn't abuse his power to get his way or accumulate things. When hungry and tempted to turn stones into bread, he was willing and able to wait for your provision at the right time. He didn't lust for power or glory, though he

deserved those very things. Even when he was filled with dread before he died and you declined his request for the cup to pass from him, he did not argue or disobey, but submitted to your will and provision. Now his perfect contentment is ours. O God, fill us with a gratitude that is radically transforming and makes us willing and able to give up everything this world can offer in order to love and follow Christ. Remind us often of the great inheritance you have prepared for us; help us to wait well and to thank you humbly for every small mercy you give us each day. Amen.

Westminster Larger Catechism

Q 146. Dear Christians, what is the tenth commandment?

- A. The tenth commandment is, "You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's."
- Q 147. What are the duties required in the tenth commandment?
- A. The duties required in the tenth commandment are such a full contentment with our own condition and such a charitable orientation of our whole soul toward our neighbors, so that all of our inward motions and desires relating to them tend to, and work for, the support of everything of theirs which is good.
- O 148. What are the sins forbidden in the tenth commandment?
- A. The sins forbidden in the tenth commandment are discontent with our own state and envy and grief at the good state of our neighbors, together with all excessive feelings and desires for anything that is theirs.
